




### PROCESS WORK



The design for NEXT is inspired by the elevated rail system that runs through the streets of Chicago. The "L tracks" run above ground, weaving through skyscrapers and city buildings to connect neighborhoods and allow the citizens of Chicago to get from point A to point B. This represents the work ethic of NEXT employees as they collaborate with one another and take clients on a journey from their first meeting to project completion. Representing the Elevated track, the 7th floor will house client and collaborative areas as well as recreational spaces such as a coffee shop for clients and NEXTers to stop on their commute. The 6th floor will reflect the city streets of Chicago, with a grid-like layout that allows workers to maneuver efficiently around the city loop. A circulation loop, clearly defined by corresponding colors and graphics inspired by the "L" map will assist with wayfinding and spatial organization in the office. Industrial materials reflective of the cityscape and train cars themselves along with architectural features within the space will add visual interest and reflect the sights one would see as they look out the window of a moving train car or look up at the tracks from below.



### THE RED LINE

Chicago's busiest line offers a direct route through downtown and passes many major landmarks, such as the workstations and private offices.

### THE GREEN LINE

Passes through the neighborhoods of Chicago, stopping at each team meeting room.

### THE BLUE LINE

Features several stops at Chicago's popular attractions along the core of the loop, such as the four private offices and the flex office.


### THE ORANGE LINE

Dubbed as Chicago's tourist line, the orange line takes clients directly from reception to the main attractions such as the Coffee Stop and the Client Presentation

### THE PINK LINE

Known for it's unique stops, the pink line travels along the building perimeter to each huddle room.





The NEXT coffee shop functions as the first stop on the orange route. Clients are able to stop for refreshements on their way to the presentation room. The Coffee Stop is also an additional space for NEXTers to work away from their desks, with open seating for collaboration and recessed booth seating for private work.




Floor 7 - Elevated Track

Collaborative workstations include ergonomic seating on casters to move between desks. Height adjustable desks allow NEXTers to choose their own work plane and provide standing room to look at each other's screens. Layout respects the existing grid of the space while paying homage to the city grid.


The work cafe pictured to the right is the final destination on the **red** route and is an area where NEXTers can gather for weekly meetings or take breaks during the work day.







Underneath a mushroom cap, a maze of organic lines can be found. The natural ridges and valleys inspire the layout of Caraway's flagship store with central test kitchens and corridorsw that promote curvilinear pathways and exploration of the space. Acoustic ceiling solutions mimic the unique structure of the mushroom cap while the eclectic, residential experience invites users to explore the brand and experience the functionality of their products.





The general display shelves resemble bookshelves and allow customers to experience products in the desired environment. The design has corridors to mimic the natural ridges and valleys of the **mushroom** cap and uses ceiling baffles to mimic the organic repetition and pattern. Curved corners mimic the round shape and promote circulation.







ADA Suite


**Equilibrium** is inspired by the history of the 1960s and the artistry of famous painter, Jackson Pollock. The complex and intricate linear forms in Pollock's paintings often engulf the viewer and create what he deemed an equilibrium of his entire personality—the good and the bad. This represents the turbulent decade of the 1960s, with monumental social changes, tragedies, and advancements. This design will reflect the **balancing act** of midcentury design, where a period of chaos brought about a style that prided itself on simplicity and functionality. This balance and equilibrium will be reflected in the material choices within the space with bold tile and simple wood panels, as well as the layout itself with a simply designed and decorated entertainment floor and a moody living floor. Brighter finishes on will help the ground floor be more visitable by providing more visual contrast.















The ground floor features brighter finishes and an open plan that aide in **visitability** and represent Jackson Pollock's lighter work. The moody living floor is the second floor of the split level and represents Pollock's darker work and has a closed plan to give the family a place of refuge after the family barbecues.
